Scottoiler Sponsor Short Way Round



Last year Scotttoiler had a request for sponsorship from Adam Lewis and Danny Burroughs when they were planning their 'Short Way Round' trip around the world and further. At Scotttoiler we get a lot of requests for sponsorship but these guys really stood out so we decided to support them on their adventure. Both bike enthusiasts, they started off their trip with a couple of BMW F650 GS's with lots of modifications ranging from 21" front wheels for better handling off road to an Autocom system for bike to bike communication and not to mention a brand new Scotttoiler Touring Kit.

Adam got his first bike at the age of 16 and two years after that he entered the British championships where he spent ten years riding mostly in the 600 Supersport class but also Production, Single Cylinder and the Triumph Speed Triple Challenge. He raced in North America on three occasions and also Northern Ireland and Austria.

Danny's motorcycling background is mainly in motocross but he has also ventured into Road Racing and spent some time competing in 6 & 8 hour endurance events. He spent the three years prior to this trip racing supermoto all around the UK. In 2005 he spent his weekends with the Crescent Suzuki Superbike Team as James Haydon's tyre man.

The pair rode through everywhere from England to Australia and also entering some of the more, whichever way you look at it, adventurous or dangerous regions including Pakistan and South America crossing through the notorious East of Pakistan. Adam stated.

"All across Iran we had been warned about the road east to Pakistan" said Adam "We were told everything from 'you'll have to report to the police station' to 'you'll have to sleep at the police station' and from 'you'll have to have a police escort' to 'the police will pick you up on the road and escort you whether you like it or not'. As it was, the worst part of the journey was the cross wind on the desert section between Bam and Zahhedan. It was a struggle to keep the bikes going in a straight line".
